

Village of San Jose
Board Meeting
August 15, 2022

Monthly Board Meeting was called to order by President Worlow at 7pm, on Monday, August 15, 2022. Meeting was held at Village Hall, 309 S 2nd Street San Jose, Illinois. Roll call taken: Present: Allen; Cross; Blackstock; Nolan; Price, Tillquist; 6 present. Also, in attendance: President Worlow, Clerk Shelley and Chief Smith. Citizens M. McGinnis and M McGinnis's Mother were present. Meeting agenda was posted more than forty-eight in advance on the village website, outside and inside bulletin boards at Village Hall and is attached to and made part of the minutes.

President Worlow asked for approval of the Consent Agenda, Trustee Allen made motion to approve Consent Agenda, 2nd Trustee Nolan, roll call vote: Allen yea; Cross yea; Blackstock yea; Nolan yea; Price yea; Tillquist yea; motion carried 6 yeas.

Citizen's Concerns:

McGinnis stated they would comment during the police discussion

President:

President Worlow would like the Village website updated to include pictures of all board members along with the committee they chair, Mayor Worlow and Nikoloi. The contact number for everyone will be Village Hall number.

President Worlow stated a citizen has requested stop signs be installed on Linden at 3rd Street. Ordinance 22-577 will be voted on Clerk section.

President Worlow stated the 2022 Mitigation Plan should be approved by board members. Trustee Allen made motion to approve 2022 Mitigation Plan, 2nd Trustee Nolan, roll call vote: Allen yea; Cross yea; Blackstock yea; Nolan yea; Price yea; Tillquist yea; motion carried 6 yeas. President Worlow discussed mowing 101 Locust, 213 W Race and 112 N 1st, the abandoned properties in town. Trustees agreed to charge property owners \$50 for each mowing and properties would be mowed when maintenance had time. Trustee Allen made motion to approve mowing abandoned properties, 2nd Trustee Price, roll call vote: Allen yea; Cross yea; Blackstock yea; Nolan yea; Price yea; Tillquist yea; motion carried 6 yeas.

Clerk:

Trustee Allen made motion to approve Ordinance 22-575, Changes to Garbage Disposal Rates, 2nd by Trustee Nolan, roll call vote: Allen yea; Cross yea; Blackstock yea; Nolan yea; Price yea; Tillquist yea; motion carried 6 yeas.

Ordinance 22-576, Permitted Special Uses was deferred to Thursday August 18, Special Board Meeting.

Trustee Price made motion to approve Ordinance 22-577, Stop and Yield Intersections, 2nd by Trustee Cross, roll call vote: Allen yea; Cross yea; Blackstock yea; Nolan yea; Price yea; Tillquist yea; motion carried 6 yeas. Stop signs will be placed on Linden at 3rd Street.

Discussion regarding the cameras that are not working resulted in a motion by Trustee Price to obtain two bids on fixing the existing system, 2nd by Nolan.

Engineer:

President stated he advised Scott DeSplinter that he did not need to attend meeting. New Lift Stations is in service.

Finance:

Payment of Bills – Trustee Allen made motion to pay bills, 2nd Trustee Nolan, roll call vote: Allen yea; Cross yea; Blackstock yea; Nolan yea; Price yea; Tillquist yea; motion carried 6 yeas.

Zoning:

President reminded trustee that Zoning Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, August 18, 2022, with a Special Board Meeting immediately following.

Maintenance:

Trustee Nolan made motion to approve purchase new weed eater under \$300, 2nd by Trustee Allen, roll call vote: Allen yea; Cross yea; Blackstock yea; Nolan yea; Price yea; Tillquist yea; motion carried 6 yeas.

Trustee Allen made motion to hir Nikoloi VanWye ad full time employee, 2nd by Trustee Price, roll call vote: Allen yea; Cross yea; Blackstock yea; Nolan yea; Price yea; Tillquist yea; motion carried 6 yeas.

Discussion regarding cell phone for Nikoloi was deferred to August 18th meeting.

Water, Sewer & Garbage:

Trustee Blackstock made motion to approve \$225 Water Conference attendance for Kim Albers, 2nd by Trustee Allen, roll call vote: Allen yea; Cross yea; Blackstock yea; Nolan yea; Price yea; Tillquist yea; motion carried 6 yeas.

Police:

Police Chief Smith reported that he and Ordinance Officer Marlo handed out new ordinance warnings and followed up on prior warnings. Marlo mailed two tickets. Chief Smith issue one citation and towed one vehicle. He reported vandalism complaints at playground and old grade school were posted on Facebook. Trustee Nolan suggested Smith contact Alex Hamilton regarding cameras at park. Smith also stated that Michelle Skelton checked old Methodist church an found no evidence of drug sales. Smith stated he heard a resident was bitten by a dog, but he had no additional information.

Smith was not sure if McGinnis property is zoned residential or agriculture. 5-4-2. Animal Houses: Location of Certain Animals states that only properties zoned for agriculture can house animals. Ms. McGinnis stated they have had animals on the property since the 1990s and they have no intention of removing the animals. They expect the property to be rezoned to agricultural or grandfathered for livestock.

Chief Smith to research radar gun repair or cost of new radar gun.

Trustee Price to put together a proposal to reward citizens who clean up their yards.
