

Village of San Jose
Monthly Board Meeting
October 17, 2022

Monthly Board Meeting was called to order by President Worlow at 7:00pm, on Monday, October 17, 2022. Meeting was held at Village Hall, 309 S 2nd Street San Jose, Illinois. Roll call taken: Present: Allen; Blackstock; Nolan; Price, Tillquist, Cross; 6 present. Also, in attendance: President Worlow, Clerk Shelley and David Mason from Summit Energy. Meeting agenda was posted more than forty-eight in advance on the village website, outside and inside bulletin boards at Village Hall and is attached to and made part of the minutes.

Citizen's Concerns:

President:

David Mason stated Summit Energy has researched well versus new water line to McGinnis property and determine digging a well was the more economical solution. Mayor Worlow stated he will contact village lawyer Pat McGrath regarding writing an ordinance for variance on residences >600' from water main. Clerk Shelley will send an email to McGrath requesting that village and Summit Energy have no liability for the well.

Mayor Worlow advised board members of letter sent to 100 Race St. regarding damage to village property. Additional damage will result in a \$190 fine and possible water disconnect. Clerk Shelley will advise the water clerk to put notice on back of next water bill about damage to village property.

CLERK:

Clerk Shelley discussed the changes to Ordinances 22-578, 22-579 and 22-580. Allen made motion to approve ordinances, 2nd by Price. Alley aye, Price aye, Blackstock aye, Cross aye, Tillquist aye and Nolan aye. Motion carries.

Board members agreed to set Halloween hours at 5 pm to 8 pm on October 31st.

ENGINEER:

Nothing to report.

FINANCE:

Allen made motion to pay bills, 2nd by Tillquist. Allen aye, Price aye, Blackstock aye, Cross aye, Tillquist aye and Nolan aye. Motion carries.

Treasurer Shelley advised board that she is working on appropriations and tax levy for 2023 and asked board members and mayor to submit out of ordinary purchases as soon as possible. Appropriations and tax levy due to counties no later than 12/31/2022.

ZONING:

Nothing to report.

MAINTENANCE:

Mayor Worlow stated that Nicolai is working on pricing for salt/cinder, but usual supplier does not have material.

Trustee Price explained additional work required on tree trimmed by village maintenance department. Allen made motion to approve no more than \$500 to trim Price tree and no additional money will be spent by village for Price tree maintenance, 2nd by Blackstock. Allen aye, Price aye, Blackstock aye, Cross aye, Tillquist aye and Nolan aye. Motion carries.

WATER, SEWER & GARBAGE:

Nothing to report.

POLICE:

Chief Smith reported 10 citations were issued, 6 warnings, 2 medical calls, 1 theft report, 1 domestic, 1 suspicious person, 2 follow up investigations, 3 nuisance calls, 1 assist Logan county, 2 ordinance violation citations, 2 trials with 2 convictions and 1 pending trial.

STREETS & ALLEYS:

Trustee Blackstock requested that reflective markers be put at Payne and 136. Mayor Worlow stated he will get with maintenance to complete request.

HEALTH & SAFETY:

Trustee Nolan stated mosquito spraying is complete for 2022.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chief Smith reported a fire had been set on village property at south end of 3rd street. Mayor Worlow advised property is now chained and locked.
