

Village of San Jose
Streets and Alleys Committee Meeting
January 21, 2017

Meeting called to order by Chairman Smith at 9am. Those present: Tibbs, Smith Absent: Skelton
Others in attendance: Joey Larmore and Mike Burris

Meeting agenda was posted more than forty-eight hours in advance of the meeting on the outside and inside bulletin boards at Village Hall and is attached to and made part of the minutes.

Discussed work which was done in 2015 including, Vine from 1st to 2nd, Mulberry from 1st to 2nd, Linden from 3rd to 4th, 3rd St by Worlow's and County Rd by McGinnis.

A discussion was had about adding Truck routes in town, Burris advised that our town truck routes are fine except for possibly the intersection at 1st and Arch. Burris explained that making a road a truck route consists of adding 10" of aggregate and then oil and chipping it, which would eat up most of the money in the MFT fund and we wouldn't get other things done. The intersection talked about that may need repair is already a truck route and would be more than \$2000 to repair that intersection alone; however there are roads in town that are in worse repair.

It was noted that there is \$24,000-\$25,000 at this point in the MFT fund. Work that was suggested to be done is:

Spray patch various location around town at a cost of \$2000 per day with the hope of only 2 days needed.

Seal coat and repairs of half 5th St from 136 Rt 136 (Main St) to Walnut - \$4500

Full repair of Mulberry between 2nd and 3rd - \$8050

Full (blowout) repair at 2nd and Linden - \$2000-\$3000

Grading at Arch St - \$800

Payne St between Rt 136 to alley - \$3000-\$4000

These come to \$23,350 with an added cost of Engineering for \$1400-\$1500.

Burris discussed talking to township about helping us out by hauling stone or some kind of help since we are thinking of fixing Payne St by their building.

There was a discussion as to the importance of getting work done by the Otto's house as soon as possible; we have been waiting for the Water main project to be completed. It was noted that should be end of this or beginning of next year and then we should look strongly at getting that road finished up.

Burris suggested looking into raising the sales tax 1/2 % to be earmarked for MFT.

Smith asked about grants, to which Burris said it is very competitive and we are actually only \$600 under the poverty level for median household income in San Jose; other local towns are lower.
